2. **Why was Admiral Bruce unhappy with the existing Royal Navy base in Chile? What did he order to be built in Esquimalt Harbour as a result?**

3. **Describe the former Royal Naval Hospital. Who worked there and how many wards were there?**

4. **What concerns led to the creation of the Canadian Navy in 1910? Who renamed it the Royal Canadian Navy and when?**

5. Describe some of the artefacts found during excavation at Esquimalt Dockyard. How do you think they got there? *HINT: The answer to this question can be found in Ships Bell gallery on the left as you enter Naden Building 37.

6. What is the current toast-of-the-day for today? Has the modern toast changed much from the traditional toast? Why do you think that is? *HINT: The answer to this question can be found in the Mess Dinner display.

7. Using the signal flags painted on the wall as a guide, draw the flags that represent Bravo Zulu (BZ). Be sure to label the different colours. HINT: The answer to this question 7 can be found in the Oriole Children's Gallery.

8. What was a *convoy* and why were they important? HINT: The answer to this question can be found in the Battle of the Atlantic Gallery.

9. In your own words, describe what a depth charge is and what it does. HINT: The answer to this question can be found in the Battle of the Atlantic Gallery.
